A few excerpts from the presentation:

What's Important to our School Community? (Distilled from faculty, student, and family feedback)

- Early college courses and faculty
- Robust counseling department with mental health supports
- CTO/college advising program
- Smaller class sizes (ideally 20-22 students)
- Adequate funding for art and science lab supplies, and for Year 1s and 2s to have their own copies of Seminar texts
- A longer summer bridge program in 20-21 that includes more focus on writing and math competencies
- College-level library databases/resources
- Admissions staff/resources that reach all corners of the city
- Funding for faculty research/conferences and training on equity and restorative practices
- Funding to take Year 1s to Bard College and on the college trip
- Alternative teacher certification program so we can hire people from higher education

Resources

- 1. SY21 Charter per pupil allocation: \$9,112 (down from \$9,199 in SY20)
- 2. Projected enrollment: 450
- 3. Total funding available: \$4,100,400 + \$108,821 for students with disabilities (decrease of \$48,349 + \$11,944 from FY20)

Costs and Fees

- Personnel (salary + fringe): \$3,405,658 (no reduction in force)
- School nurse: \$13,000
- Tuition reimbursement: \$11.250
- Sick leave conversion: ?
- Summer IEP meetings: \$538
- College Board fees for SAT administration: \$7,282.50
