Dean Croson:

We are currently working on two data points:

- Students we are not reaching for various reasons, including access to technology
- Ensuring students are aware of the resources that are available to them
 1. Chrome Books on loan from Bard Baltimore
 2. Hot spots on loan to students from Bard Baltimore

Thirty-five students have signed up for tutoring that has been offered from undergraduates from Bard College in Annandale, New York. They will provide one-on-one tutoring during this period of school closure. Each tutor would work with his/her/their tutee for two 45-minute sessions per week. They are being trained and supervised via Brothers at Bard, a support organization at the campus. Students and families will be notified when the sessions will begin.
